Solar Panels

In 2018, a set of solar panels were installed to run the well water pump, and a portion of the Clinique.

2018

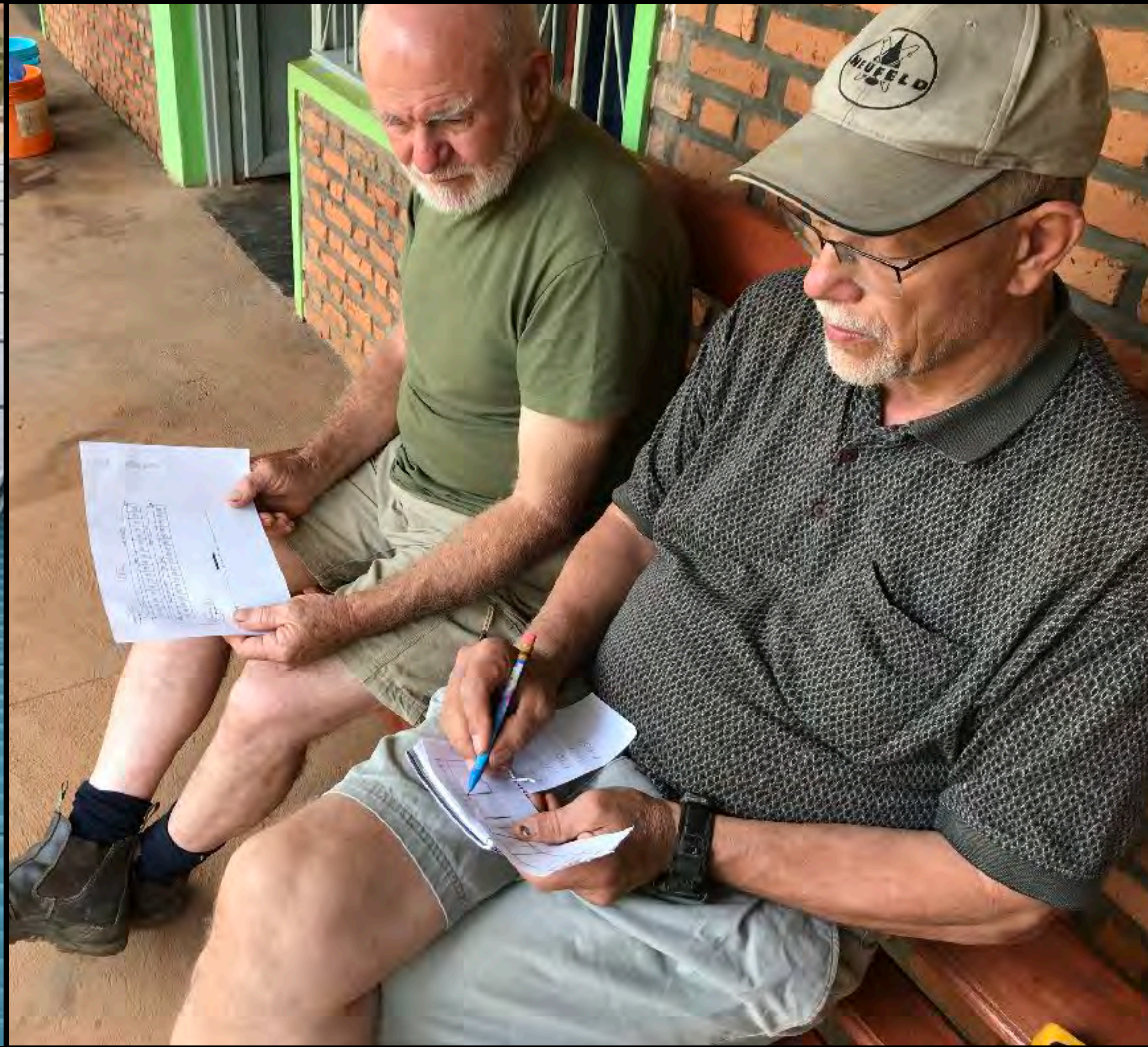
*36 panels

The power to the Clinique usually lasts until about 10:00 pm.

2020 Financial Challenges

ROB NEUFELD

- COVID-19 tests cost \$65.00, which the Government administers. This makes it not possible to test at Ubuntu Clinique.
- COVID has resulted in many extra costs as noted in the presentation (i.e. higher drug costs, new washing stations, building a wall around the compound, water storage, etc.)
- In 2019 the Burundi Government contributed \$26,280 to Ubuntu, but due to other priorities in this fiscal year the Government did not contribute.



Financial Revenue for 2020

ROB NEUFELD

We are thankful for....

\$37,000 from individuals who are supporting Ubuntu Clinique

\$40,000 to equip the operating room, DeFehr Foundation provided matching funds from other Winnipeg and BC donors.

\$20,000 towards pharmaceutical costs
from International Mennonite Health Association (IMHA)

\$12,000 from a BC donor towards the additional COVID expenses

\$50,000 from 3 BC donors towards general operating & equipment costs

\$16,000 from patients payments



Financial Needs for 2021

DAN BLOCK

Ubuntu will need to raise:

- \$100,000 towards general operating costs
- another \$50,000 from Government and patient fees

Expenses include:

- \$72,000 - Salaries (42 staff, including 5 Doctors)
- \$48,000 - Drugs and Medical Supplies
- \$30,000 - Other Costs



Project/Equipment needs

DAN BLOCK

Most Urgent Equipment Needs

- An incubator for the Maternity ward (\$6,000)
- 2nd sterilizer machine (\$1,500)
- 3rd oxygen concentrator (\$3,000)
- X-ray machine (\$25,000)
- Shipping Container and Transport (\$19,500)
to send 400 donated solar panels from Winnipeg to Bujumbura
- Post Surgery room (\$40,000)
Note: An additional \$25,000 is being contributed locally (labor and materials: gravel, timber, bricks and sand)

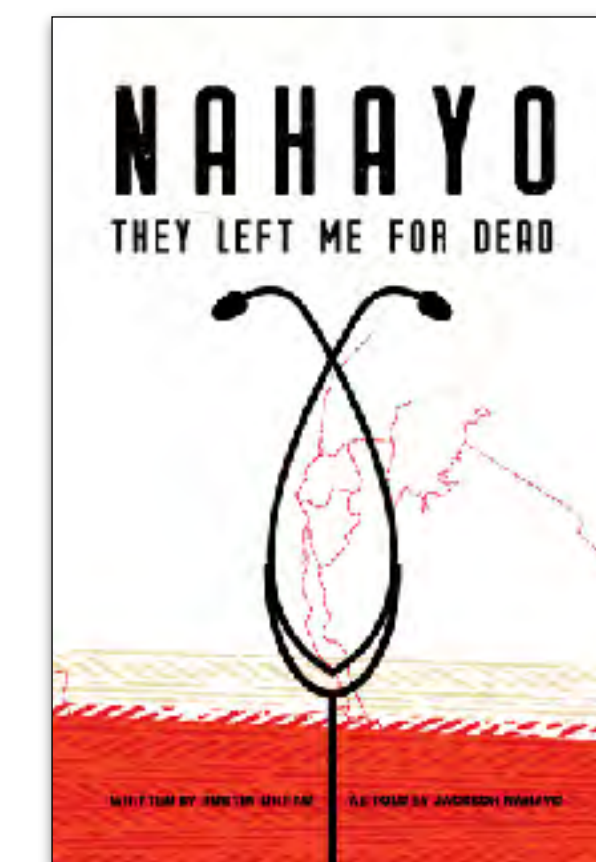
